




## 88<sup>TH</sup> TEXAS LEGISLATURE

- NOVEMBER 8: GENERAL ELECTION
- NOVEMBER 14: FIRST BILLS MAY BE FILED
- EARLY JANUARY: COMPTROLLER PROVIDES BIENNIAL REVENUE ESTIMATE (~JANUARY 11)
- JANUARY 10: 88<sup>TH</sup> LEGISLATURE CONVENES
- JANUARY: OATH OF OFFICE, SPEAKER ELECTION, GOVERNOR'S STATE OF THE STATE, COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENTS
- MARCH 10: LAST DAY TO FILE (MOST) BILLS
- MAY 29: SINE DIE

## SELECTED LEGISLATION

## HB 445 by Rep. Schofield

Requires ballot in bond election to detail projects to be funded, amount for each. Prohibits expenditures on projects beyond voter approved amount and transfer of funds between projects. Grants voters injunctive relief. *Heard in House Committee 4/19.* 

## HB 1489 by Rep. Tepper

Under current law a certificate of obligation may be issued for a public work, an undefined term. HB 1489 would define a public work and authorize a county to issue only in response to a public health emergency, declared disaster, or lawsuit. *Heard in House Committee 4/5.* 

### House Joint Resolution 109 by Rep. Burns

Proposes a constitutional amendment to eliminate the office of county treasurer in Somervell County. *Heard by House Committee on County Affairs 4/19.* 

## Senate Joint Resolution 28 by Sen. Middleton

Proposes a constitutional amendment to eliminate the office of county treasurer in Galveston County. *Referred to House Committee on County Affairs 4/12; identical companion, HJR 134, approved by same committee 4/26.* 

## Senate Bill 175 by Sen. Middleton

Would prohibit the expenditure of public funds on anyone required to register as a lobbyist with the Texas Ethics Commission or for the payment of dues to a nonprofit state association who contracts with one, such as TAC or TACA. *Referred to House Committee on State Affairs 4/13.* 

## HB 2014 by Rep. Leach

Would raise jury pay on first day from \$6 to \$20; state would newly reimburse first day, at \$14. Would raise, from \$40 to \$58, jury pay for subsequent days; state currently reimburses subsequent days at \$34/ea.—this bill would raise reimbursement to \$52/day. *Received in the Senate 5/1*.

## House Bill 537 by Rep. Wu


Requires governmental entities to make records relating to an internal audit available to the public on request and to post the final audit reports within 30 days of completion on a publicly accessible website. Failure to comply without good cause subjects the governmental entity to liability to the requestor for expenses incurred attempting to access the records, including attorney fees. Maintains current law's protection for audit working papers. Considered in Calendars 4/13.

### House Bill 458 by Rep. Craddick

Would require the Texas Juvenile Justice Department to take custody of a youth committed to TJJD within 30 days or compensate the county for the cost of detention for the 31st and subsequent days. *Referred to Senate Committee on Criminal Justice 4/24.* 


